2006 Commonwealth Nations Bridge Championship:

The 2006 Commonwealth Nations Bridge Championship will be held along similar lines as the inaugural event in Manchester in 2002. This event will be held at the Victoria Bridge Association premises in Melbourne, 7-12 March 2006.

To date, 15 countries have indicated that they wish to attend at this stage (some are yet to respond). These are Antigua*, Bangladesh, Barbados*, Bermuda*, Canada*, England*, Guernsey*, Malaysia*, Malta*, NZ, Pakistan*, Singapore*, Sri Lanka*, Uganda* and Wales* (countries with a * indicate that they participated in Manchester). There will also be a team from each of the Australian States and Territories, an Australian team, an International sponsor team and two Australian sponsor teams. It is expected that 30 teams in total will participate.

Paul Hackett has agreed to organise the International Sponsor team. Barry Noble has volunteered to sponsor the event and captain one of the Australian Sponsor teams.

Club Level Director's Course:

The Club Level Director's Course is designed for two types of players. The first are those who would like to become Directors at their local club. The other is for players who simply want to better understand the rules and their rights at the table. Sean Mullamphy is an excellent teacher and one of the most experienced Directors in the country. \$15 is a bargain for a course such as this.

This course will teach you about *The Laws of Contract Bridge 1997* (the rules under which we play), the simple movements you are likely to come across in a club (such as Mitchell, Howell, Rover, etc) and how to score (how to score when the computer goes down).

I, personally, did the course in 2001 to learn about my rights and responsibilities at the table. I learnt simple things like when to call the Director, when not to call the Director, etc and found it very useful every time I have sat down to play since.

If, like me, you decide you want to be a Director, you can take home the exam to complete for an additional \$10. Sean will mark it and, should you pass, you will receive a certificate stating this qualification.

Later in the year there will be a more advanced course for those interested in going further with their directing. Passing the club level exam is a pre-requisite for the next course.
